2019 Analysis

- 69% of children have achieved at least the expected standard in maths
- 64% of children have achieved at least the expected standard in reading and writing
- 77% of children have achieved at least the expected standard in writing
- In this cohort of children there are many children with significant needs.
 2 children have autism and 6 have learning difficulties as well as emotional/social needs.
